RELEVANT LAW(S): Michigan Election Law, MCL 168.719

ISSUE/PROPOSAL STATEMENT: Re-name section removing all language except that identifying members of the Election Commission.

Sec. 3-102. [Department of Elections] Election Commission.

The Department of Elections is headed by the City Election Commission, composed which is comprised of:

- 1. The <u>City Clerk</u>, who, as the chief elections officer of the city, is chairperson;
- 2. The President of the City Council; and
- 3. The Corporation Counsel.

RATIONALE: "Section 3(a) of the Michigan Home Rule City Act, MCL 117.3(a), requires that a city charter provide for a city clerk. In addition, Section 719 of Michigan Election Law, MCL 168.719, provides that a city election commission shall perform such duties relative to the preparation, printing and delivery of ballots as required by law of county boards of election commissioners.

"Sections 3-101 through 3-108 of the 1997 Detroit City Charter intermix the separate responsibilities the Office of the City Clerk and the City Clerk as the "chief elections officer of the city" who is the chair of the Election Commission. The recommended changes provide a clear delineation between the responsibilities of the Department of Elections and the Office of the City Clerk. In addition, the recommended changes provide a clear delineation between the role of the City Clerk as a member of the Election Commission and as the head of the Office of the City Clerk."-Mayor Bing Administration, Letter, Rec'd December 21, 2010.
