RELEVANT ORDINANCE SECTION: RELEVANT LAW(S):

<u>ISSUE/PROPOSAL STATEMENT</u>: Chief of Police should be appointed by City Council. Make it mandatory that stolen goods recovered by the police be returned to their owner and steps be taken to identify the owner. Drug test all city employees once a year.

RATIONALE: "The Chief of Police should be appointed by the City Council. This is too much power and responsibility to be held in the hands of only two people. We've seen in the recent past what this can cause. Too much corruption and the Police do not do their jobs unless they can receive a bonus, as for writing tickets.
