CHAPTER 1. CITY COUNCIL	
Sec. 4-113. Prohibition on interference in <u>A</u> dministration.	
Except for purposes of inquiries and investigations, the <u>City Council, as a Body</u> , or its members, <u>individually</u> , shall deal with City <u>officers appointees</u> and employees who are subject to the direction and supervision of the <u>Mayor solely through the Mayor</u> , and neither the <u>City Council, as a Body</u> , nor its members, <u>individually</u> , shall give <u>verbal or written</u> orders to any such <u>officer appointee</u> or employee, <u>either publicly or privately including through adoption of any resolution</u> .	
RATIONALE : "As a strong-Mayor form of municipal government, the City Council is required under all circumstances, except for inquiries and investigations, to make all requests of Executive Branch appointees and employees only through the Mayor. This change clarifies that the prohibition extends to City Council resolutions." -Mayor Bing Administration, Letter, dated December 20, 2010.
