CHAPTER 4. CITY PLANNING COMMISSION.	
Sec. 4-402. Powers and duties.	
The <u>City Planning Commission</u> shall advise the City Council <u>on zoning matters and</u> on development matters as defined in <u>Section 6-204 of this Charter</u> , and perform other functions as directed by the city council any matter. <u>but is not authorized to take any action on a matter that is under the jurisdiction of the Executive Branch of City Government.</u> Any resolution adopted by the Commission is advisory and shall not be binding until adoption <u>of the resolution</u> by the <u>City Council</u> .	
RATIONALE: "Since adoption of the 1997 Detroit City Charter, the City Planning Commission staff has been directed by the City Council to handle matters, such as the licensing of adult entertainers, which is outside the Body's jurisdiction. The change in this section clarifies that the City Planning Commission and its staff have limited jurisdiction and may not implement programs, services, and activities." -Mayor Bing Administration, Letter, dated December 20, 2010.
